# To Stain the Pride of All Glory

YRE was a center of great business. Her ships sailed forth to return with precious gain. Pleasantly situated was this city where the breezes from the Mediterranean cooled her brow and the ripple of waves washed her feet.

Yet Tyre was destined to come down. First she should be chastened for a period of seventy years, but this chastening taught her no lesson. She returned from the depressions and disheartening circumstances more estranged from God than before. She had become hardened rather than softened.

"After the end of seventy years shall Tyre sing as an harlot."

Can we not see Tyre as a warning to us of the present? The world has suffered through war, famine, depression, discontent. All the nations have suffered. Have we not lifted up our voice as an harlot? You can imagine the coarseness with which a harlot might sing and the character of the songs which would be attractive to her.

When the financial war began between the ASCAP and the radio chains we hoped that the radio chains might dig into the past and bring forth some of the old songs which had at least decent sentiment in them. But not so. They accepted anything that could be ground out to fill the space. Perhaps the songs of uplifting sentiment were under control of the ASCAP. If that were so the chains could not then use them. But is not much of the current singing "like that of an harlot"? This is written as an appeal to the children of God that we choose songs of beauty

and spirtiual value and then that we sing them as Christians ought to sing.

A young woman was asked to sing in a district gathering. She chose an old well-worn gospel hymn which very few who were planning to sing a solo would choose. But she put her soul into the song and sang the gospel. It melted the audience. We need that in worship which brings God, and God is not to be found in the flapper class of music doggerel.

We wish the people of God to be representatives of a better country, the land of pure delights where saints immortal stand.

We would have a worship which is aflame through the grace and presence of God. By no means would we discourage Christian freedom and joyful singing to the glory of God. We need melody which lifts the human spirit above the depressing influences of the world of today. But let our singing be "psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs" into which God may enter.

It is beyond our present knowledge to know what the nations are coming to. The Bible makes it plain that in the last days there will be a breaking up, making way for the coming of the Man of sin. Antichris-


tian powers are working with superhuman zeal at present. Are we to see a return of the woes that were pronounced against Tyre of old?

The sentence against Tyre was "to stain the pride of all glory" and "to bring into contempt all the honorable of the earth." The judgments were to be against human self-elation and against the vain boast of men held in high esteem. We believe in sincere preparedness for any eventuality in these days when heartlessness has risen to conquer. We believe such preparation might be made in a spirit of humility and trust in God and not in a spirit of pride or selfconfident glory. Such days as these in which we live call for selfabasement and supplication before our Lord and God.

We cannot but contrast the spirit shown by Nebuchadnezzar at the zenith of his power and the spirit shown by Hezekiah when he was challenged from without. Nebuchadnezzar had seen a rich kingdom built up. His city of

THE CITY OF TYRE

In 595 B. C. Ezekiel prophesied (26:1-14) the complete destruction of Tyre. Ten years later Nebuchadnezzar began his siege on Tyre, which lasted for thirteen years, and completely destroyed the city. The surviving inhabitants later returned and rebuilt the city on an island one half mile from the mainland. Two hundred and forty years later (322 B. C.) Alexander the Great demanded the right to worship in the island stronghold. When the inhabitants refused him this privilege he became angry and commanded his army to attack the city. They literally "scraped her dust" (Ezek. 26:4) from the old site into the sea and made a causeway out to the island. Thus Tyre was captured and the city became "a place to spread nets upon." Ezek. 26:5. Recently, however, on the site of the original city, warehouses have been constructed to facilitate shipping.



# After You Have Received Power

N Acts 1:8 we read: "But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you."

Oh, the power of the Holy Ghost! the power that quickens, that reveals, and prevails! I love to think that Jesus wanted all His people to have power, that He wanted all men to be overcomers. Nothing but this power will do it. Power over sin, power over sickness, power over the devil, power over all the powers of the devil!

In order to understand what it means to have power there are two things necessary; one is to have ears to hear and the other is to have hearts to receive. Every born-again saint of God, filled with the Spirit has a real revelation of that truth, "Greater is He that is in you than he that is in the world." I say this with as much audacity as I please. I know evil spirits are in abundance and in multitudes; Jesus cast them out as legion. The believer because of the Spirit that is in him has the power to cast out the evil spirit. It must be so; God wants us to have this power in us; we must be able to destroy Satan's power wherever we go.

One day as I came into the house my wife said, "Which way did you come?" I answered that I had come in by the back "Oh," she said, "if you had come in by the front you would have seen a man there in a terrible state. There is a crowd of people around him and he is in terrible straits." Then the door bell rang and she straits. Then the door ben rang and she said, "There he is again. What shall we do?" I said, "Just be still." I rushed to the door and just as I was opening it the Spirit said, "This is what I baptized you for." I was very careful then in opening the door, and then I heard the man crying outside, "Oh I have committed the unpardonable sin, I am lost, I am lost." I asked him to come in and when he got inside he said again in awful distress, "I am lost, I am lost." Then the Spirit came upon me and I commanded the lying spirit to come out of the man in the name of Jesus. Suddenly he lifted up his arms and said, "I never did it." The moment the lying spirit was out he was able to speak the truth. I then realized the power in the Baptism of the Holy Spirit. It was the Spirit that said, "This is what I bap-tized you for," and I believe we ought to be in the place where we shall always be able to understand the mind of the Spirit amid all the other voices in the world.

After the Holy Ghost has come upon you, you have power. I believe a great mistake is made in these days by people tarrying and tarrying after they have received. After you have received it is, "Go ye." Not "sit still," but "go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel." We shall make serious havoc of the whole thing if we turn back again and crawl into a corner seeking something we already have. I want you to see that God depends on us in these last days.

There is no room for anyone to boast and the man who goes about saying, "Look at me for I am somebody," is of no value whatever. God is done with that man altogether, He will have a people to glorify Him. He is doing what He can with what He has, but we are so unwilling to move in the plan of God that He has to grind us many times to get us where He can use us.

Jesus was so filled with the Holy Ghost that He stood in the place where He was always ready. He was always in the attitude where He brought victory out of every opportunity. The power of the Holy Spirit is within us but it can be manifested only as we go in obedience to the opportunity before us. I believe if you wait until you think you have power after you have received the Holy Ghost you will never know you have it. Don't you know that the child of God who has the Baptism is inhabited by the Spirit? You will remember one time when they tried to throw Jesus from the brow of the hill, that He pressed through the midst of them and as soon as He got through He healed the man with the blind eyes. Pressing through the crowd which was trying to kill Him, He showed forth His power. Some people might think that Jesus should have run away altogether but He stopped to heal. This thought has comforted me over and over again.

One day as I was waiting for a car I stepped into a shoemaker's shop. I had not been there long when I saw a man with a green shade over his eyes, crying pitifully and in great agony. It was heart-rending and the shoemaker told me that the inflammation was burning out his eyes. I jumped up and went to the man and said, "You devil, come out of this man in the name of Jesus." Instantly the man said, "It is all gone, I can see now." That is the only Scriptural way, to begin to work at once, and preach afterwards. You will find as the days go by that the miracles and

healings will be manifested. Because the Master was touched with the feeling of the infirmities of the multitudes they instantly gathered around Him to hear what He had to say concerning the Word of God. However, I would rather see one man saved than ten thousand people healed. If you ask we why, I call to your attention the Word which says, "There was a rich man and he fared sumptuously every day." Now we don't hear of this man having any diseases but it says, "In hell he lifted up his eyes." We also read that there was a poor man full of sores and "he lifted up his eyes in heaven," so we see that a man can die practically in good health but be lost, and a man can die in disease and be saved; so it is more important to be saved than anything

But Jesus was sent to bear the infirmities and the afflictions of the people and to destroy the works of the devil. He said that the thief (which is the devil) cometh to steal and to kill and to destroy, "but I am come that ye might have life and have it more abundantly." I maintain that God wishes all His people to have the life more abundant. We have the remedy for all sickness in the Word of God! Jesus paid the full price and the full redemption for every need and where sin abounds, grace can come in and much more abound, and dispel all the sickness.

When I was traveling from England to Australia I witnessed for Jesus, and it was not long before I had plenty of room to myself. If you want a whole seat to yourself just begin to preach Jesus. However, some people listened and began to be much affected. One of the young men said to me, "I have never heard these truths before. You have so moved me that I must have a good conversation with you." The young man told me that his wife was a great believer in Christian Science but was very sick now and although she had tried everything she had been unable to get relief, so was having a doctor. But the doctor gave her no hope whatever and in her dilemma and facing the realities of death she asked that she might have an appointment with

When I got to her I felt it would be unwise to say anything about Christian Science so I said, "You are in bad shape." She said, "Yes, they give me no hope." I said, "I will not speak to you about anything but will just lay my hands upon you in the Name of Jesus and when I do you will be healed." That woke her up and she began to think seriously. For three days she was lamenting over the things she might have to give up. "Will I have to give up the dance?" and again I replied "No." "Well, we have a little drinking sometimes and then we play cards also. Will I have to give—?" "No," I said, "you will not have to give up any-

thing. Only let us see Jesus." And right then she got such a vision of her crucified Saviour and Jesus was made so real to her that she at once told her friends that she could not play cards any more, could not drink or dance any more, and she said she would have to go back to England to preach against this awful thing, Christian Science. Oh, what a revelation Jesus gave her! Now if I had refused to go when called for, saying that I first had to go to my cabin and pray about it, the Lord might have let that opportunity slip by. The other day we were going through a very thickly populated part of San Francisco when we noticed a large crowd gathered. I saw it from the window of the car and said I had to get out, which I did. There in the midst was a boy in the agonies of death. As I threw my arms around the boy I asked what the trouble was and he answered that he had cramps. In the name of Jesus I commanded the devils to come out of him and at once he jumped up and not even taking time to thank me, ran off perfectly healed. We are God's own children, quickened by His Spirit and He has given us power over all the powers of darkness; Christ in us the open evidence of eternal glory, Christ in us the Life, the Truth, and the Way.

God wants us to have power. When I was traveling in Sweden at a certain station early in the morning a little lady and her daughter got into the train. I saw at once that the lady was in dreadful agony and asked my interpreter to inquire as to the trouble. With tears running down her face she told how her daughter was taking her to the hospital to have her leg amputated.

Everything that was possible had been done for her. I told her Jesus could heal. Just then the train stopped and a crowd of people entered until there was hardly standing room, but friends, we never get into a place that is too awkward for God, though it seemed to me that the devil had sent these people in at that time to hinder. However, when the train began to move along I got down, although it was terribly crowded, and putting my hands upon the woman's leg I prayed for her in the name of Jesus. At once she said to her daughter, "I am healed. It is all different now; I felt the power go down my leg," and she began to

## The Treasures of the Suow

That pioneer explorer of the wintry storm, the late Wilson A. Bentley, of Jericho, Vermont, laid the world under a lasting debt of gratitude for his very remarkable achievements in the field of photomicrography. Bentley succeeded in photographing through a microscope thousands of specimens to snow crystals over a period of more than a third of a century. Of those thousands of photographs he never found two alike.

I asked Mr. Bentley if he had any theory to account for the almost invariable hexagonal or six-pointed symmetry that characterized his crystals.

"Of course no one knows but God, but here is my theory," said he. "As you know, snow crystals are formed from water vapor at temperatures below freezing, and water is composed of three molecules, two of hydrogen combined with one of oxygen. Each molecule is charged with both positive and negative electricity, the tendency of which is to polarize at opposite sides. The number three, you see, enters the business at the start."

His remark about the "three at the start of the business" set me to thinking. May not it be that the triune God, who fashions all the loveliness of creation, has signed His "threeness" in these fragile stars of ice crystals as an artist signs his name to his masterpiece?

Curiosity impelled me to examine the references in the Bible containing the word "snow," and I found to my delight the same "threeness" inhering there. There are twenty-one (seven times three) references containing the noun "snow" in the Old Testament, and three in the New. I found three references speaking of "leprosy

white as snow." Three times cleansing from sin is likened to snow. I found three more speaking of raiment being of the whiteness of snow.

Three times the Son of God in appearance is likened to snow. But what was my amazement to find the Hebrew word for "snow" made up of threes entirely! It is a fact, even though not generally known, that having no numerals both Hebrews and Greeks used the letters of their alphabet as numbers. Only the casual glance of a Hebrew at the word "sheleg" (Hebrew for "snow") would be needed to see that it reads 333 as well as "snow." The Hebrew for the first letter answering to our "sh" is 300, the second consonant "1" is 30, and the final one is our "g"—3. Add them up and we have 333, three digits of three! Curious, isn't it? But why should we not expect mathematical exactness in a Book plenarily inspired, and fully as wonderful as the world God has made?

Of God it is said: "Great things doeth he, which we cannot comprehend, for he saith to the snow, fall thou on the earth." Job 37:5, 6, R. V. He speaks and it is done. Try to imagine how many millions of billions of snow crystals can fall upon an acre of ground in an hour's time and imagine if you can the staggering fact that each crystal bears an individuality all its own, a design and a pattern without a duplicate in this or any other storm. "Such knowledge is too wonderful for me; it is high, I cannot attain unto it." Psalm 139:6.

## The Sin That Damus

But if you forgive not men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses. Matt. 6:15.

OW little we know of what is seething and boiling in the hearts and minds of those with whom we come in contact, of sorrow, shame, despair, fear; of anxiety, perplexity, hunger and longing for God—of bitterness, resentment, wounded feelings, judging, unforgiveness, ah, stay—unforgiveness, that is it that accounts for almost all the trouble!

How very few people really forgive how few even know what God means by forgiveness. The miserable meager thing that is handed round among God's people as forgiveness is not the beautiful, wonderful thing God speaks of.

Should we not pray with one of God's glorious saints, "Lord, let the light of the Truth in Thy words flash into us and sting us into an awakening and a crying to Thee for the Spirit's meaning of Thy Words"?

Forgiveness is a good word, and whatever a good word means when it is used by man, it means a million times more when used by God. Think of such words as Saviour, Father, Unity, Compassion, Forgiveness, Home, Love! The word forgiveness at once suggests that a wrong has been done and the wrong has built up a barrier of some kind between human spirits. It is written, "He that dwelleth in love dwelleth in God, for God is love." Love is the prime mover in forgiveness—Love goes before and makes a path for forgiveness to follow. I love—and because I love there must be no barrier, cloud, or wall between me and any other one.

Forgiveness is *never* negative; forgiveness is never mere indifference or letting a thing pass for time to cover it over. Forgiveness is a putting away—an absolute doing away with that that has come between. Forgiveness is love, that must have the wrong undone, put right, obliterated. Forgiveness is the sending away of the wrong that lies between—saying in the Name of Jesus, "Go, thou demon."

It is not possible for God to dwell where there is any unforgiveness, for God is Love, and love cannot endure a cloud between That is not forgiveness that says to a brother or sister in Christ, "I forgive, but we had better keep away from each other."

No sin can have forgiveness in this world or the next if he who should forgive prefers to cling to his feeling of dislike for someone who has done him a wrong. This attitude of mind shuts him out from both his brother and his God, and if persisted in will bring him at last to the "outer darkness where there is wailing." This attitude of soul is spiritual suicide. "God is love. If a man love not his

"God is love. If a man love not his brother whom he hath seen, how can he love God whom he hath not seen?"

If God could forgive, while such a spirit of unforgiveness toward another is clung to, what would it mean? It would be as if God said, "I do not care, you can be unforgiving. No doubt he has treated you badly, and you can hold a grudge against him and be separated from him. I don't mind."

As soon as we hold a grudge against another the stream of God's forgiveness must therefore necessarily cease to flow towards us (and are we not needing His forgiveness all the time?) or else God would become a partaker of our sin! God loves the sinner—and will forgive the sinner, but he never merely pardons sin, He expels it, He curses it—He withers it up—He does not merely cover it over with His blood—He blots it out.

Why is not the power of God manifested among God's people as on the day of Pentecost? Lack of unity of spirit! On that day they were of one heart and mind. And why the lack of unity now? One major reason is unforgiveness of petty and greater grievances, coupled with a willingness to be separated from our brethren. In the Holy Spirit there can be nothing of this sort.

This willingness for separation tends to increase, for "ill weeds grow apace," and become an active purpose not to forgive. This is extremely serious, for as we refuse to forgive or hesitate about doing so or fail to do so, we have to face this truth expressed by Christ: "But if you forgive not men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses." "And his lord was wroth and delivered him to the tormenters . . . so likewise shall My heavenly Father do also unto you, if ye from your hearts forgive not every one his brother their tresspasses." Matt. 18:34, 35.

Babylon was a dazzle of luxury. As he viewed it the pride of his heart, burst all bounds and he exclaimed, "This is great Babylon that I have built." But had he been unassisted in bringing his kingdom to its excellence? He failed to give God honor for the accomplishments which he had made. Then God would have him learn that "the Most High ruleth in the kingdoms of men and that He setteth up whom He would." Nebuchadnezzar stepped from his splendor to the open fields to gather his food with the beasts of the

earth that he might know what man is, without the help of God.

In contrast, when Hezekiah was threatened by the Assyrians who arrogantly declared their ability to conquer whether Godbe with Hezekiah or not, this humble king spread their threatenings before the Lord and prayed, reminding God that He could deliver whether with many or with few. Taking God into his confidence he had God on his side as a partner and the Assyrians were driven back without the need of a single combat.

Prayer is needed that God may be sought by those who are guiding our nation, that a spirit of dependence on Him may be felt, that He may go with us.

How much a praying church is needed! It cannot be expected that all in the nation will feel a need of God. The unconverted know not God, how then can they seek Him? But believers know Him and "the prayers of a righteous man availeth much." May our President and those in official place have the constant prayers of the people of God. We ought not to pray that the Lord would make them follow a course such as our ideas might direct, but that they may be guided by God to do those things which are, in His sight best for the nation. As Samuel said to Saul, "God forbid that I should sin in ceasing to pray for thee," may we not sin in prayerlessly trusting to fate to guide in days of darkness through which we are now called upon


And, whether the world recognize its need of God or not; whether it plunge into darkness or not; may it be true of the Church of Christ, as it was with the Children of Israel during the dark days in Egypt, that there be light in our dwellings. In experimenting in Germany it was found that a lighted match could be seen for half a mile, an ordinary lantern two and a half miles, and light from a well-lighted room sent its beams through the window which could be seen at a distance of twelve miles. The darker the world the farther will shine the light of God from the believer's heart. "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in

heaven."

As Spirit-filled Christians we have an important place to fill. Whether the world is fast approaching its final catastrophe we do not know. While we are here may we worship in Spirit and in truth, labor fervently and thoughtfully, and let men everywhere know that we are partakers of that stability of peace, reverence, and love that is in the sight of God of great price.

They live in an environment where disinterested kindliness is seldom encountered, and when they see Christians acting so, they realize that they are as famished for a like experience as a homesick boy is for his home. When they enter an assembly where they can see that the happy-faced Christians are hugely enjoying their fellow-

Moreover for a Christian to be happyhearted and hence happy-faced, and enjoying loving fellowship with his brothers and sisters is what God expects of him, and a most delightful experience for himself.

A sad-faced sour-looking Christian knows, when he thinks of it, that he is running in reverse, so far as concerns making the church seem a desirable place to be. He knows also that it is not true of him that he has "joy unspeakable and full of glory," neither is it true that his "shouts he can't control."

He must have different feelings. What can he do about it? God will help, and if he really sets about praying for a happyfaced salvation God will give it to him, and so make him a paying advertisement for Christianity. He can pray, "Restore unto me the joy of Thy salvation." But there is something on the natural plane that he can do about it too. Let him purpose in his

heart to smile, whistle, or hum a tune, when he is alone. Carry this out when before folk. Doing this he will prove the truth of what the famous Dr. William James of Harvard said:

"Action seems to follow feeling, but really action and feeling go together; and by regulating the action, which is under more direct control of the will, we can indirectly regulate the feeling which is not. Thus the sovereign voluntary path to cheerfulness, if our cheerfulness be lost, is to sit up cheerfully and act and speak as if cheerfulness were already there.

But the Scriptures show us a yet more excellent way. We move into the realm of joy via the pathway of praise and thanksgiving, as we take the attitude of the Psalmist who declared: "Bless the Lord, O my soul: and all that is within me, bless His holy name. # Thirty-Two Years with Camibals

When I first came to the Yagba tribe, in the Sudan, they did not have enough cloth in the whole tribe to make a lady's hand-kerchief, and not enough paper to make a postage stamp. They had no written language. At their cannibal feasts, the older people ate the meat and the youngsters drank the broth of the stew made from human flesh. Now there are seventy-five churches in that district, and thousands are reading the Word of God in their own language. Scores of former cannibals, and their children, gather at the Communion table. Cannibalism has disappeared, and I doubt very much if you can find a nude person in the whole tribe. What effected the change? The transforming power of the gospel of Christ!

In this Yagba tribe twins were decapitated and eaten before they were eight hours old. One morning two breathless young men called me out of bed at 3 a. m. They shouted to me to come quickly. I hurriedly dressed, and followed them—running and walking alternately—for six miles to a village. But when I arrived, I was told I was too late. I was taken to the market, there I found a woman wailing bitterly, weeping with comfortless sorrow, like Rachel of old. Her twins had been stolen from her, beheaded and eaten. In that same village later, I found the remains of seventy pairs of twins just outside of the town wall.

Some years later Mrs. Titcombe and I became the proud and happy parents of twins. When our dear children—a boy and a girl—were three years old, I took them to this same village where I had found the many twin babies murdered. When the old men saw our twins, they were afraid, and uttered, in sheer astonishment, "Why they are human!" I said, "Of course they are. They said, "Oh my, we thought when a mother gave birth to twins that she was no longer a human being, but an animal, and that is why we killed and ate the twin children."

Motherless babies were either thrown into the bush alive, there to be devoured by the hyenas or some other wild animal, or buried with their dead mother, strapped to her back—all because no one would care for them.

Once a year a young girl was sacrificed to the god of thunder, for they believed that if the sacrifice was not made there would be no rain that season. After the girl was sacrificed her body was eaten by the villagers.

How is one going to reach such people? We must do as 1 Cor. 9:22 exhorts, "become all things to all men, that we might by all means win some."

Some years ago I was on an interesting itinerary. Three native boys were with me, carrying on their heads the loads of equipment. When we reached the jungle just outside of a village we saw three human skulls hanging across the road. My boys did not want to go any further, but I told them I was going in, and I instructed them to wait outside.

When I got inside I sat down under a tree, for I was tired. Looking up, I saw that the tree was decorated with human skulls and bones. Presently a woman came along, and she was almost the means of my undoing. She carried a pot of water, and I asked for a drink; but in doing this I made a mistake, for I spoke to a woman before going to the chief. When I did go to the chief, he was as wild as a mad bull, roaring and shouting. I asked the Lord to help me.

Another woman came to the scene, and she proved to be a friend in need. She had a large calabash of food, and this is one thing the average man cannot resist, so the old man quit cursing me and sat down, with another man, to eat.

It is the custom in this tribe to ask the stranger to eat with you. This old, nude cannibal had asked the other man to eat with him, but he did not ask me. I seized the opportunity, spoke up and reminded him that he was treating me worse than he would one of his lowest subjects, in not asking me to eat with him. He grunted a little, and asked me to eat. Asking no questions as to the nature of the food, for conscience sake, but asking God's blessing on the food that I was about to eat, I put in my fingers with them and ate. In a moment the old man jumped to his feet and fairly shouted, "You are my friend forever!"

"All right," I said, "If I am your friend, call your people together, I have a message for them." This he did. Then I had the joy of singing and telling them the old, old story of Jesus and His love. Three days later when I told the chief that I was going, he said, "Don't go; your words have made our stomach sweet too much." In three days what a change had come over these people. I entered the village alone; but when I left a host of the people came along and accompanied me a considerable distance.

Today, in that village, the skulls are buried, the idols are all gone, and hundreds of redeemed souls worship our Lord Jesus.

Some years ago we were faced with famine conditions because of lack of rain. There was no relief board around the corner or filled granary that we could appeal to. The pagans promised to bring much-needed rain. How they shouted and screamed out their prayers! The old priest even got into a palm tree that he might be nearer to his god. At the end of a week they sacrificed a bull and ate the flesh raw, to bring the rain. But no rain came. The whole scene was almost a repetition of the scene on Mount Carmel, Elijah vs. the false prophets of Baal.

Next the Mohammedans in the tribe tried to bring rain. They fasted for a week and prayed—but no rain.

The next week, after I had given a message in the church, the native pastor came to me in a serious frame of mind. "White man," he said, "is it not time for us to pray for rain?" I had been waiting for this. I asked him about the prayers of the pagans. "Oh, white man," he said, "their idols have ears, but they hear not!" "How about the Mohammedans?" I continued, "they have no idols." "True," he said. "Mohammed lived and died, and that was the end of him. Therefore he can neither hear nor answer." "What, then, makes the difference?" "Oh, white man," he said earnestly, "Jesus came from Above! He was born of a virgin; He lived and died and came out of the grave on the third day and now He lives! He said, 'All power is given unto me in heaven and on earth."

"Fine," I said. "Give me a promise to stand upon." He gave me James 5:17-18. I then told them that we would gather in the church the next day to pray for rain. Two hours later the drums were beating out the message—the Christians are going to pray for rain. So all the community knew about it. "Now we will see," said the people, "who has the God that lives." A similar condition prevails at home. The world is asking God's people to show forth somethting of His power in their lives, to live as becometh children of God.

The next day was very hot; not a cloud was in the sky. When the church bell rang there still was not a cloud to hang our faith upon, but we had the promises of our God. Outside of the church an unbelieving bunch of pagans and a group of sneering Mohammedans had gathered. I went down to the church ten minutes after the hour. When I got into the church I saw the big umbrella hats in the aisle of the church. I asked what they had them for, and they answered, "Have we not come to pray for rain?" They came in faith, prepared for the answer.

We got down on our knees and began to pray. Five minutes, ten minutes, twenty minutes—and a groan went up from the souls of these one-time cannibals, "Lord, we need rain." Five minutes later the windows of heaven were opened, and the rain came. They surely needed their unbrella



hats to go home. The pagans said, "We prayed for a week, and fasted, but no rain; the Mohammedans prayed and fasted for a week, but no rain; the believers pray for twenty-five minutes, and we get all the rain we need.'

Surely, friends, we can fully trust our Saviour; Jesus never fails.

There are still seventy million souls in Africa who are yet to hear the gospel. What will your part be in giving them the Words of Life?—Christian Victory.

## **Compassion**

"I have compassion on the multitude." Mark 8:2. "And Jesus went about all the cities and

villages, teaching in their synagogues, and preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and healing every sickness and every disease among the people. But when He saw the multitudes, He was moved with compassion on them, because they fainted, and were scattered abroad, as sheep having no shepherd." Matt. 9:35, 36.

Compassion is pity for suffering with a

desire to help or to spare, and may be likened to the gate valve which opens the channel through which the life giving stream flows from the reservoir to the thirsty one. It awakens and enlarges the flow of love. A ministry without the outflow of divine love is a pitiful farce. A lawyer may look upon his fellowmen as so many prospective clients, a physician as so many prospective patients, a merchant as so many prospective customers, an under-taker as so many prospective corpses, the one thirsting for fame as a means of gaining his own selfish aim, but the true minister sees others only through the eye of compassion and is constrained by one paramount desire, to help, relieve, alleviate, suc-

cor, comfort and encourage. "I have compassion on the multitude." What a pattern to His people, the tender compassion of Jesus! He found the world He came to save a moral Bethesda. The wail of suffering humanity was everywhere borne to His ear. It was His delight to walk its porches, to pity, relieve, comfort, heal, save! The faintest cry of misery arrested His footsteps—stirred a ripple in the fountain of infinite Love. Was it a leper that dreaded name which entailed a lifelong exile from friendly looks and kindly words? There was One at least, who had words and deeds of tenderness for the outcast.

"And there came a leper to him, beseeching him, and kneeling down to him, and saying unto Him, If Thou wilt, Thou canst make me clean. And Jesus, moved with compassion, put forth his hand, and touched him, and saith unto him, I will, be thou clean." Mark 1:40, 41.

Was it some blind beggars on the Jericho highway, groping in darkness, pleading for help? "And Jesus stood still. . . . What wilt thou that I should do unto thee? . . . Lord that I might receive my sight, ... Go thy way, thy faith hath made thee whole. . . And immediately he received his sight." Luke 10:46-52.

Was it the speechless pleadings of a widow's tears at the gate of Nain, when she followed her earthly pride and only support to the grave?

"And when the Lord saw her, he had compassion on her, and said unto her,

Weep not, and He came and touched the bier, and they that bare him stood still. And he said, Young man, I say unto thee. arise. And he that was dead sat up, and began to speak. And He delivered him to his mother." Luke 7:11-18. Even when He rebukes, the bow of com-

passion is seen in the cloud, or rather, that cloud, as it passes, dissolves in a rain-shower of mercy. He pronounces Jeru-salem "desolate" but the doom is uttered among a flood of anguished sorrow! Matt. 23:37-39, Mark 13:34, 35. Reader, do the compassionate words and

deeds of a tender Saviour find any feeble echo and transcript in yours? traverse in thought the wastes of human wretchedness, does the spectacle give rise, not to the mere emotional feeling which weeps itself away in sentimental tears, but to an earnest desire to do something to mitigate the sufferings of woe-worn humanity? How vast and world-wide the claims of your compassion!-now near, now at a distance—the unmet and unanswered cry of perishing millions abroad—the heathen-dom which lies unsuccored at your own door-the public charity languishing-the Mission staff dwarfed and crippled from lack of needful funds—a suffering district a starving family—a poor neighbor—a helpless widow-some neglected orphans-it may be, some crowded hovel, where misery and vice run riot-or some lonely sickchamber, where the dim lamp has been wasting for dreary nights—or some desolate home, robbed of its domestic peace and happiness, or which death has entered, where 'Joseph is not, and Simeon is not," and where some sobbing heart, under the tattered garb of poverty, mourns, unsolaced and unpitied, its loved and lost. Are there none such within your reach, to whom a trifling pittance would be as an angel of mercy? How it would hallow and enhance all you possess, were you to seek to live as almoner of Jehovah's bounties! If He has



given you of this world's substance, remember it is bestowed, not to be greedily hoarded or lavishly squandered. Property and wealth are talents to be traded on and laid out for the good of others-sacred trusts, not selfishly to be enjoyed, but generously to be employed.

# Europe at War - - and the Gospel at Work

E ARE pleased to have had the co-operation of the Russian and Eastern European Mission for a number of years, assisting us in the supervising of the missionary activities of our Council representatives in Eastern Europe. Conditions brought about by war have necessitated the withdrawal of practically all the General Council workers from Europe with the exception of one in Germany and two in Greece. Under the circumstances we are resuming our former policy of contacting the European field direct wherever there seems to be opportunity to assist and encourage the ministry of the native workers.

#### Appeal from Argentina

An appeal has come to us to give assistance to our brethren of the Pentecostal faith in Argentina, particularly the Russian and Slavic peoples who have immigrated to that land. This appeal is being answered by our appointment of Gustave Kinderman who will visit Argentina and its adjoining republics, making contacts with the different groups of believers, seeking to encourage them in the faith and to help them in any way he can to become established in the Lord as well as to cement more closely the ties of fellowship with our Assemblies of God movement.

It may be of interest to some of our readers to know something more about our Brother Kinderman who, although he has been affiliated with the General Council for many years, was occupied as a missionary of the Russian and Eastern European Mission until war conditions necessitated his withdrawal from Europe.

#### Early Life

Gustave Kinderman was born in Lodz which was at that time part of Russia but after the World War was ceded to Poland. He was brought up in the Roman Catholic faith and had not even entered a Protestant church until 1915 when, after coming to this country he attended a Methodist service in Philadelphia. At that time he was somewhat awakened spiritually but was not saved until five years later, on Thanksgiving Day, when he found the Lord at Highway Tabernacle, Philadelphia, of which Ernest Williams, our General Superintendent, was at that time the pastor.

#### Called to Service

Brother Kinderman continued in business for a time but soon felt the call of God to the European work. He first returned to Europe in 1925 and as a result of this visit two of his relatives in Danzig were won for the Lord.

In 1929 he again went to Europe, this time under the appointment of the Russian and Eastern European Mission, to help in office work and missionary activities. Later he was appointed to the position of secretary-treasurer at the field headquarters in Danzig. His work included the distribution of funds to workers in the various European countries, and handling correspondence in the four languages in which he is fluent—Russian, German, Polish, and English. He also taught in the Danzig Bible School and because of his linguistic ability was called upon on many occasions to act as interpreter

During this time he visited practically all the European countries, including Lithuania, Latvia, Poland, Jugoslavia, Rumania, Bulgaria, Hungary, Slovakia, and Greece, contacting the believers in these places and ministering the gospel.

#### War Clouds

In May, 1939 Mr. Kinderman left Europe, partly on account of ill health but mainly because of the political tension. At that time the national spirit was running high and foreign missionaries had to be very guarded in their

movements. It was felt that Mr. Kinderman, having established contacts with the main works and workers, would be in a better position to give assistance to the field as a whole by returning to the United States than by remaining in Danzig and perhaps being cut off from communication with other countries.

Mr. Kinderman, because of his knowledge of European languages, has handled for us the sending of remittances from our Emergency Relief Fund to various European countries. He has translated for us letters of acknowledgment which he received from two brethren in Jugoslavia who were given assistance from our funds. We pass on to our contributors their words of grateful appreciation.

One from Jugoslavia, writes: "I wish to express herewith my sincere thanks to all the brethren and sisters in the Lord, although unknown to me, for this rich offering which I received from you as from the Master's hand. It is my prayer that the Lord reward you all richly in material as well as in spiritual things.

"There are many hungry souls here who seek the Lord but few are the laborers. Because of the secular work which I must do in order to take care of my family, I have little time in which to work for the Lord. Therefore, I ask you to kindly join with me in prayer that the Lord will stand by me in order that my wife, three boys and mother may be provided for."

#### · Laborers Are Few

A letter has also been received from another brother in Jugoslavia: "I am very thankful for the help received and especially grateful to the dear children of God who made this possible. Their actions prove that they have compassion for the lost souls in Jugoslavia.

"In our land are places where people are hungry for God's Word but no one is here that can go and preach to them. Please join with us in prayer that laborers may be thrust forth. There are a few who would go but the secular work holds them back, consequently the work of God suffers.

"In my free time I am visiting assemblies and experience many blessed hours with the believers in various places. During a recent visit to Novi Sad where it was our privilege to minister, the Lord wonderfully blessed His word and ten people were saved.

"I am confident that the Lord will make it possible for me soon to devote full time to the ministry. Please join us in prayer that our work may be strengthened in Jugoslavia, and again we wish to express sincerest thanks for the help you have sent."

#### NEWS FROM NEAR AND FAR

EL SALVADOR, CENTRAL AMERICA—"I have just returned from a lengthy trip throughout the northern part of the republic. We visited new places and Christians that have not been visited previously by our missionaries. Fellowship meetings were held with the natives in two different districts. In the first, seven souls were saved, and in the second twenty-one were saved and severiteen backsliders reclaimed. We found a good spirit of progress in all the places, but it is our real concern to see a true Pentecostal revival with people receiving the Baptism in the Holy Ghost."—T. Burt Evans

KOUDOUGOU, IVORY COAST—We have received word from Mr. and Mrs. Harold Jones who request us to pass on a word of thanks to their contributors. We are able to get funds through, but since the mail service is so delayed and uncertain it is doubtful whether friends will receive personal acknowledgment of their offerings, at least for some months. Punalur is thirty-eight miles from their former station, Mavelikara, and is located in a part of the field for which they have felt burdened for years. While the work in the past largely has centered around Mavelikara and it will now involve more travelling to keep in touch with the assemblies, they felt that those stations now required less supervision and that it was God's time for them to move their center to this needy part of the field. It is felt too that Punalur will provide a good location for the Bible school, affording splendid opportunity for practical work in the surrounding villages and the tea and rubber estates.

Miss Graner and Miss Ginn feel that there is almost a greater need than they are able to fill—to carry on the old work as well as pressing forward in the new, with the Bible school, services and visitation work. Pray that God will give them strength, spiritual and physical, to carry on for Him.

The crowds have been small but we believe God is preparing the hearts of our people for a revival. Pray and believe with us!

BRAKPAN, TRANSVAAL, SOUTH AFRI-CA-"Over the New Year we made a trip into Basutoland, which is a very mountainous country, some of the peaks reaching to 11,000 feet. We visited the Mount Tabor Mission Station, which is about 340 miles from Brakpan and there we received a splendid welcome from Mr. and Mrs. Kast, missionaries from Switzerland who are carrying on faithfully in that section. The Lord gave us good meetings. It was easy to preach for the people responded as we ministered the Word from day to day. On New Year's Day about 350 to 400 attended the services. # Opportunites in Europe 'Joday

A recent interview with Gustave Kinderman reveals some interesting facts regarding the extent and condition of the work in war-affected European countries at the present

Mr. Kinderman states that the liberty of ministry granted to our brethren in Europe rests in many cases on the attitude of the local authorities. If the local officials are kindly disposed and are not pressed by certain other recognized religious bodies to persecute the believers, they will tolerate the Pentecostal work. On the other hand if pressure is brought to bear upon the police authorities, naturally they will carry out instructions. In larger towns it seems that the authorities are more lenient, but in some of the villages and outlying places it is necessary for the believers to come together

in secret meetings because of the extreme intolerance. Thus in certain sections the work is going forward unmolested, whereas in other parts such as the Wendish section of Jugoslavia all the Pentecostal churches have been closed.

#### Measure of Liberty

There are certain larger evangelical bodies such as Baptists, Methodists, and Nazarenes which in the past have been recognized by the Ministry of Religion, and these are still per-

subjects which were well attended and proved profitable. Among the main speakers at the convention were Marguerite Flint, of North India, H. C. Ball who represented the Latin-American work, and our Home Missions Secretary, Fred Vogler, who with his wife and daughter was present at the convention. The messages were inspiring and the pictures shown each evening gave a clearer conception of the work which is being carried on in other lands. More than twenty-five missionaries from all parts of the world were in attendance at the meetings.

"During this convention," says Brother Hardin, "many of us 'lifted up our eyes' until now the field is not just Southern California, but a lost world groping for help, in need of Christ who alone can bring order out of chaos, light out of darkness, peace out of war, and give us an inheritance among them which are sanctified. Praise God from whom all blessings

mitted religious liberty. In some cases our Pentecostal brethren have sheltered under the wing of these larger denominations and are thus able to minister with the same liberty that they are enjoying. In part of Hungary one of our ministers is working in association with the Methodists who place no restrictions whatever on his activity.

In Bulgaria the Pentecostal workers have joined forces with the other Protestant groups in the formation of an evangelical union so that they might present a united front before the government.

#### German Occupied Territory

In Germany and German-occupied Poland Pentecostal groups have merged with the Baptist movement and many of the workers are receiving full support from the Baptist organization. The leader of this organization, who is a man of God and sympathetic toward the full gospel message, at one time expressed personally to Mr. Kinderman his appreciation of the Pentecostal people and the joy and happiness manifested in their lives. It is felt that as long as he remains at the head of the Baptist work, our Pentecostal brethren will have full freedom in ministry.

#### Russian Occupied Territory

In White Russia, where the Pentecostal movement has not been able to shelter under the wing of any of the denominations but is struggling along in the face of persecution, Brother Kinderman expresses the opinion that the work has been established to the extent that it should be able to continue through indigenous groups. Information recently received indicates that the believers are carrying on as heretofore, that many are inquiring the way of salvation and that some have been baptized in water. A letter from Lithuania also states that gospel work there is continuing as in

In the section of Russia which was formerly Poland, religious liberty has been curtailed in some areas. Here again much depends on the attitude which the local authorities take and the manner in which they interpret the law.

Many of the leaders of our work who formerly devoted their entire time to the ministry have found it necessary to take up secular work in order to support their families, which of course has limited the extent of their ministry.

#### Communication with War-affected Countries

In regard to sending funds to Europe, whereas we have been able to help some workers, there are difficulties in the way of sending any regular maintenance.

Our brethren in these war-affected countries are of course restricted in what they may write, and all reports received from them are worded in a very guarded manner so that suspicion may not be aroused—"But one thing we do know;" exclaims Brother Kinderman, "that such persons as profess the Lord Jesus Christ at the present time in Russian, Rumanian and Hungarian occupied territories are Christians indeed, for they must be ready at any time to pay the price of

#### BIBLES FOR GEORGIA

In what was believed to have been the largest mass dedication of Bibles in history, the Gideon Society presented 23,000 Bibles to the public schools of Georgia in a public ceremony in Atlanta recently, reports Religious News Service.

#### PROHIBITION IN OKLAHOMA

"The whole nation was interested in the effort of the liquor forces to repeal State-wide prohibition, which was written into the Oklahoma Constitution when Oklahoma became a State," says Watchman-Examiner. The repeal proposition was overwhelmingly defeated.

#### JEWS IN SWITZERLAND

Switzerland is about the only lighthouse of liberty which suffering Jews can see on the horizon of continental Europe. But the Swiss still hold firm against anti-Semitic propaganda. Two anti-Semitic societies operating in that country recently have been suspended by government order.

#### A FUTILE HOPE

#### CHRISTIAN BROTHERHOOD

The tie that binds together the hearts and interests of all true Christians cannot be severed by international strife. This fact is shown by a Church Times report which states that a German mission in Togoland is now supported by a Scottish board and directed by an American missionary. It further states that an English mission board is now providing the salaries of a German missionary in East Africa, of a French missionary in Madagascar, and of a Finnish missionary in India

#### AN OFFERING FROM AFRICA

The native Christians at a Pentecostal mission station in the Belgian Congo have shown a beautiful spirit. When they learned of the sufferings of the war refugees in Belgium, they brought gifts of money and garden produce to help them. #### A GODLY GOVERNOR

The newly-elected governor of Arkansas is Homer Adkins. According to Herald of Holiness, Governor Adkins is a real Christian who does not smoke, drink, or swear. He refused to have any rallies on Sunday; he refused to have the customary inaugural ball; and he refused to have the usual President's ball on his birthday. For fifteen years he has taught a Methodist Sunday School class out of which have come five preachers. The people of Arkansas are to be commended for their choice. Apparently they have the kind of governor who can fulfill God's requirements. David said, "He that ruleth over men must be just, ruling in the fear of God." 2 Sam. 23:3. We wish every leader in our governing bodies in America could come up to this divine standard.

#### GREECE IN PROPHECY

The way in which Greece has retained its independence through the years and at present is routing the Italians who attempted to invade her soil is interesting in the light of Daniel's prophecy. Bible students long have believed that the Antichrist would arise out of that part of the Roman Empire which had formerly been a part of the Grecian Empire under Alexander the Great. They base this conclusion upon the theory that the words, "another horn, a little one," in Daniel 7:8, and the words, "a little horn," in Daniel 8:9, refer alike to the Antichrist.

According to their interpretation, the arising of the little horn from among the ten horns in Daniel 7 represents the Antichrist arising out of the ten kingdoms which comprised the Roman Empire of old, whereas the arising of the little horn from among the four horns in Daniel 8 represents the Antichrist arising out of the four kingdoms into which the Grecian Empire was divided following the death of Alexander the Great. At first sight this appears to be a contradiction but it is not, for the Roman Empire embraced the four kingdoms of the Grecian Empire that had preceded it as a world power. The same kingdoms belonged to both empires.

It is interesting to note also that, although the Roman Empire took the place of the Grecian Empire (as the vision of the image in Daniel 2 indicated it should, the third kingdom representing Greece and the fourth kingdom representing Rome) the Lord looks upon the four kingdoms of Greece as still existing in the end time. For Daniel 8:23 says, "In the latter time of their kingdom, when the transgressors are come to the full, a king of fierce countenance, and understanding dark sentences, shall stand up." doubtedly this king is the Antichrist. In other words, Greece is still a power to be reckoned with in the end time. Mussolini's soldiers certainly are finding that the Greek army is a power to be reckoned with, for it is turning them back on every front!

#### "NO BIBLE BLACKOUT!"

Declaring that there must be no Bible blackout, the American Bible Society is endeavoring to raise an emergency fund of \$150,000 with which to provide Scriptures for those countries usually supplied by foreign Bible societies now drastically affected by war. Three fourths of the world's missionary supply of the Scriptures has come from the British, Scottish, Dutch, French, and other European Bible societies. Without these supplies our missionaries would be drastically handicapped.

## STRANDED PENTECOSTAL MISSIONARIES

The following appeal is in a December issue of *Redemption Tidings*, written by Brother Stewart, an English missionary in India:

"I wonder if you have specially remembered in prayer the Danish, Norwegian and Finnish missionaries? We know cases of Pentecostal brothers and sisters out here who have not had a letter nor any money from their homeland for six months. Some have parents, some have children in school in these invaded countries-and no news. One Norwegian brother said, 'It has meant some sleepless nights for us.' One Norwegian girl out here had a bedridden mother and an old father in the bombed area-and no news. A young mother, with two sons at school in Norway, is trying to carry on bravely in India. They need your prayers. They cannot return home. Missionaries from other countries have been able to help some of them by offerings or by giving them food."

We are glad that our Foreign Missions Department has been able to send help to a number of stranded Pentecostal missionaries through the faithfulness of our people in contributing to our Emergency Fund. However, the need still exists.

If all God's people would strive for the kingdom of God in the same way as the worldly people strive for the earthly kingdom, we would see a great change in the church. May God help each one of us to press forward in a much more earnest way for God.

# SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

Seven Years' Whole Bible Course

Elisha and the Syrian Army

Lesson for March 9. Lesson Text: 2 Kings 6:1-23.

Our lesson today is a message of courage and comfort to the child of God, situated as he is, in a hostile world and faced with many adver-saries. It would remind us again that "beyond our eyes and ears a majestic spiritual world is moving on in silence; that an unseen God has infinite unseen resources; that knowledge of the causes and outcome of things lies outside the horizon of the senses; that immense agencies may be at work in all stillness and without the slightest show, of which the worldly mind does not so much as dream."

A WICKED KING THWARTED. 2 Kings 6:8-12.

The gratitude of kings—and often of people as well!—is proverbially shortlived.

So, soon after sending Naaman, the commander in chief of his army, to the court of Samaria, and asking a favor which was so wondrously granted (see 2 Kings 5:5-14), Benhadad, King of Syria, waged war against Israel. His strategy failed. His forces returned baffled.

"Therefore the heart of the King of Syria was sore troubled for this thing, and he called his servants, and said unto them, Will you not show me which of us is for the King of Israel?" Benhadad had left God out of his calculations and could only attribute his failure to treachery on the part of his own men. How often it is that rulers of this world are in utter ignorance of the real cause of military defeat! God was on the side of Israel; those who fight against Him fight a losing battle!

And so it was that one of Benhadad's servants told him the startling truth, "Elisha, the prophet that is in Israel, telleth the king of Israel the words that thou speakest in thy bed-chamber." How did Elisha know the King of Syria's plans? God gave him a "word of knowledge by the Spirit," as He had previously done in the case of Gehazi. And does not the church of Christ today need the manifestation of this gift in order to protect itself from the onslaughts of Satan and from deception by those of his emissaries who parade in sheep's clothing?

Let us covet this gift (See 1 Cor. 12:1-8, 31)!

A WORRIED SERVANT ENLIGHTENED. 2 Kings 6:13-16.

Upon learning that Elisha was the cause of his discomfiture, Benhadad sent out to capture and destroy the troublesome prophet. The fact that he sent "horses, and chariots, and a great host," showed his fear of Elisha, and the importance he attached to getting possession of him. it seems not to have occurred to him that Elisha, who had known all of his previous plans, might know this one too! Such is often the blindness and foolish inconsistency of those who are bent on wickedness!

"And when the servant of the man of God was risen early, and gone forth, behold, an host encompassed the city both with horses and chariots." Whereupon the frantic young man who had re-placed Gehazi in the service of Elisha, returned to his master with a cry of despair, "Alas, my master! how shall we do?" Evidently this young man had not yet learned to look away from outward appearances and adverse circumstances to the unseen God who always causes His own to triumph.

Did Elisha become panic stricken too? Did he,

too, assume that he was the helpless victim of unfavorable circumstances? Not he! Conscious as always of the unseen Presence, he calmly eyed his servant and replied, "Fear not." It is a vain thing to tell a man to be unafraid without giving him a reason for fearlessness. But there was plenty of reason! "For they that be with us are more than they that be with them." Child of God, fearful amidst circumstances which seem overpowering, take heart! "If God be for us who can be against us?" Rom. 8:31-39.


ness shown them, we as Christians are enjoined to treat our enemies with



An announcement to the congregation should be made, stating

that the papers which are placed in this box each week can be had by placing two cents in the small receptacle fastened on the front of box which is provided for that purpose.

Occasionally a paper will be taken from this box by some one who does not deposit the two pennies, but on the other hand it will be found that others will drop in a nickel and sometimes

We suggest that an Evangel secretary be appointed from the church or Sunday school, who will have the oversight of this box, ordering and replenishing the supply in the box and taking the cash deposited.

As some months have five Sundays we also suggest that the papers be ordered by the quarter. At the end of each quarter a statement will be sent to the Evangel secretary who in turn will take care of the amount from the proceeds placed in the box. This makes an easy and convenient way to handle the account for these papers.
